- All fair samples must be grown in the current year, except for Class 16 Section 1 & 2 in which the beans may be from the previous year.
- Entries may not be removed before 4:30pm on Sunday September 12th, 2010.
- No treated grain will be allowed. Power cleaning is allowed in Commercial Classes.

Class 16 Commercial Classes

Sections

1. **Soy Beans**, 5lb in a clear plastic bag
2. **Edible Beans**, 5lb in a clear plastic bag
3. **Grain Corn**, 6 cobs
4. **Potatoes, late**, correctly named, 12 in a box.
5. **Potatoes, early**, correctly named, 12 in a box
6. **Field Squash**, one
7. **Second Cut Hay**, 10" slice or 5 gallon pail of loose hay
8. **Interesting or Unusual (legal) Horticultural or Crop**, sample
9. **Organic Grain**,

Class 17 Field Crop Competition

- This points competition will be scored on a basis of 75 points in the field and 25 points for fair sample. Entries are allowed within an 8 mile radius of Paisley. There must be at least 5 acres to a field and the entire field, over the minimum, will be judged, unless a 5 acre plot is suitably staked off.
- The fair samples will be judged separately and prize money awarded for them also.
- **Note: Prize Money will not be awarded without showing a sample at the fair.**
- A tie is broken by the highest points in the field.

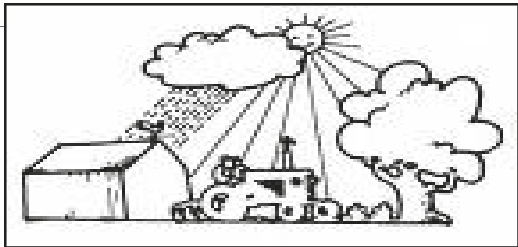
Special: Top Exhibitor
