

## Quilts and Afghans

### Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS)

#### Hand Quilting Competition Rules:

- One entry by exhibitor per section
- Quilts judged for Grand Champion and Reserved Champion must be at least 72"x90" (no kits).
- Paisley Fall Fair Grand Champion quilt will go to the District 10 competition in fall 2010. Only the first prize quilt from the District goes to the OAAS Convention in Toronto for the provincial competition. Winning quilt at the convention receives \$500.00 cash and quilt is returned to the winner.
- Please indicate on entry tag if quilt is not available to go on to District 10 competition as it will not be eligible for Champion or Reserve Champion quilt.
- Further details may be obtained from committee chairperson.
- Quilt pattern must be indicated on entry tag.
- Rosettes are awarded to Grand Champion and Reserved Champion quilts.

### Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS)

#### Machine Quilted Wall Hanging or Quilt Competition

##### Rules:

- Entries must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor.
- Entries must be a minimum of 48" x 48" on the perimeter. Total minimum perimeter measurement to be 192". Quilt may be square, rectangular, etc.
- Paisley Fall Fair Grand Champion machine quilt or wall hanging will go to the District 10 competition in fall 2010. Only the first prize quilt from the District goes to the OAAS Convention in Toronto for the provincial competition. Winning quilt at the convention receives \$500.00 gift basket and quilt is returned to the winner.
- Further details may be obtained from committee chairperson.
- Entry may not be quilted using a long arm machine and must be machine quilted by the Exhibitor. Article must have visible machine quilting.

## Class 33 Quilts

- Quilts in sections 1-9 may be shown for two years. Must appear new and clean.
- Quilt must be at least 72"x90" to be eligible for the grand and reserve champion quilt (no kits). Only quilts eligible for grand and reserve champion will be measured. Smaller quilts will not be able to proceed to the next level of competition but will be judged.
- The previous year's grand champion quilt may not be shown for a second year.

Sections:

1. **Quilt**, flip and stitch technique
2. **Quilt**, pieced cotton, name pattern
3. **Quilt**, pre-printed (cheater top)
4. **Quilt**, pieced and appliquéd
5. **Quilt**, any other kind
6. **Quilt**, quilted by a group, name the group
7. **Quilt**, appliquéd
8. **Quilt/Wall Hanging, machine quilted.** If you wish to enter OAAS competition see above rules.
9. **Quilt made by exhibitor**— can be professionally long arm quilted

16. **Hand Quilted Table Runner**
17. **Machine Quilted Table Runner**
18. **Hand Quilted Wall Hanging**
19. **Machine Quilted Wall Hanging**
20. **First time quilt exhibitor**
