- 5. Beans**, 5 pods of any variety, with stems attached
- 6. Cucumber**, 1 of any variety
- 7. Squash**, 1 of any variety (does not need to be on plate)
- 8. Pumpkin**, 1 with stem, can still be green (does not need to be on plate)
- 9. Sweet Corn**, 1 ear with husk and stem removed
- 10. Open Category**, 1 of any vegetable not listed in previous section, 3cm stem attached
- 11. Carved Vegetable**, 1 of any type of vegetable that has been carved
